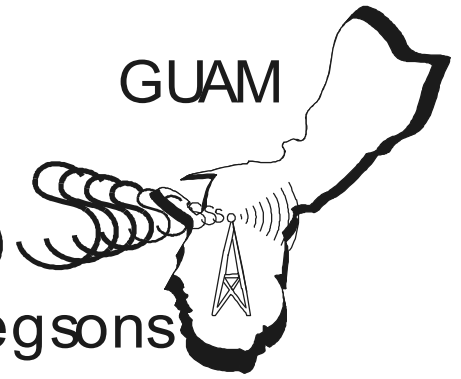

Homegoing of our Teammate Doris McIntyre

Ecclesiastes reminds us that "there is a time for everything." We at TWR-Guam experienced a difficult loss recently when staff wife Doris McIntyre went home to be with the Lord after a long battle with cancer. Doris lived her life with determination and faith, despite the heavy health trials she was undergoing. She was never one to complain or feel sorry for herself as many would be tempted to do, therefore God was able to use her to touch many people (with and without the disease) because of her faithfulness. A God-honoring memorial service with a clear gospel presentation was held here on Guam on July 10th with another to follow in Pennsylvania later on.

Please pray for Doris's husband, Jim, as he heads to the States through the holidays to be with family and supporters. He plans to return to Guam after the new year. Pray also for the McIntyres' adult children, Josh and Shelly, and their families as they grieve the loss of their mother and grandmother.

Doris's request was that, in lieu of flowers, donations be made to TWR's ministry outreach to the Nosu Yi people group in China which we spoke about in our last letter. The project manager for the Nosu Yi had this to say: "By God's grace TWR began broadcasting the good news in the Nosu language in July 2006 to reach the three million Nosu people for Christ. Most of the mountain-dwelling Nosu are polytheists or animists, worshipping the spirits of their dead ancestors as well as spirits of the hills, trees, water, earth, etc. Witchcraft plays a major role in their daily lives through exorcism, divination and appeasing the spirits, and the Nosu live in great fear of demons. Today, the gospel is proclaimed daily over the mountains where the Nosu live and people are coming to the saving knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. The incredible process from script and song writing, to digital production before reaching our transmitting site on Guam, and then back to the Nosu villages, has been a remarkable team effort." Being overseas in ministry for 20 years has caused us to feel a bit disconnected when we visit and so we would like to travel less and get plugged in more – if that is possible.

Please let us know if you think we could fit in to a ministry need or help you with projects so we can schedule accordingly. Of course, for this to work, we would need a place to stay. Some ideas for plugging us in are kids' ministries (Denise and the girls have plenty of experience in that area) and of course any technical work where Doug can use his engineering and computer talents along with sharing about the radio ministry to Asia.
